

Bravura Nova Scotia—Portia White Scholarship Application Information

Deadline for receipt of applications is March 25, 2024

The \$2,000 *Bravura Nova Scotia*—Portia White Scholarship is an auditioned award for an advanced voice student of exceptional promise. The successful applicants will study at the Maritime Conservatory of Performing Arts during the 2024-2025 school year. If the recipient wishes to continue studying with their current teacher who is not a member of the MCPA Faculty, the instructor is eligible to become a Guest Teacher at the Conservatory.

- The Portia White Scholarship is open to students of classical voice, jazz, or musical theatre.
- The award is in the form of a tuition credit at MCPA.
- The award will be divided between the fall and winter terms.
- The successful applicant will study voice and, if desired, another field related to their career interests.
- The recipient of the scholarship will attend and perform at the June 2025 MCPA Convocation.

Eligibility

- An advanced voice student
- Age 16-24 at the time of application as of April 1, 2024
- A good background in music theory or another field related to their interests (e.g., arranging, piano, or dance)
- <u>Note</u>: A student enrolled during 2024-2025 in a full-time music programme at a post-secondary educational institution is not eligible to receive this award.

Audition for Bravura Nova Scotia—Portia White Scholarship

- In choosing audition pieces, applicants should select contrasting styles, historical periods, and tempos.
- The maximum total length of the chosen repertoire is 20 minutes.
- Memorization and piano accompaniment (where appropriate) is required.
- Three photocopied copies of each score are required for the Jury.
- The Jury may ask the applicant to perform only a portion of a selection or may stop the applicant at any point during the performance.
- Auditions will be held at the beginning of May. Applicants will be informed of the date and time of their audition.
- Please note that there is a \$10.00 fee for the audition. You can e-transfer the funds to accounting@maritimeconservatory.com, call us at 902-423-1926 to pay with a credit card or drop by the office to make payment.

Candidates can apply in any one of the following three categories:

- 1. Jazz Voice: Select one piece from each List (3 pieces in all)
 - List A: A medium or up-tempo jazz standard, accompanied. Vocal improvisation (scat singing) is encouraged but not required.
 - List B: One jazz ballad, accompanied.
 - List C: One other piece of your choice, in the style of your choosing. This may be an Italian aria, art song (German, French, or English), musical theatre song, or contemporary popular song of any style.
- 2. Classical Voice: Select one Piece from Three of the Lists (3 pieces in all)
 - List A: Baroque or Classical
 - List B: Romantic and post-Romantic Repertoire
 - List C: 20th and 21st Century Repertoire
 - List D: Jazz, Musical Theatre, Operetta
- 3. *Musical Theatre*: Select one Piece from each List (3 pieces in all)
 - List A: Golden Age (pre-1965)
 - List B: Contemporary (post-1965)
 - List C: One song of Tin Pan Alley era, Sondheim, or Operetta
